water; when tender, drain it and lay it on slices of buttered toast, which has been dipped in the water that cooked the celery, add butter, pepper and salt to suit the taste, and serve hot.

A nice way to cook turnips is to peel them and slice them and cut them in pieces about an inch square. Boil in a little water until they are tender. Then brown them in a saucepan, with a little melted butter, pepper and salt, or instead of browning them, pour a little cream and the yolk of one egg—well beaten—over them.

An appetizing way to cook chicken is to cut it in pieces, as if you were to fry; dip the pieces in beaten egg and then in fine bread crumbs, seasoned with pepper and salt, and a very fine sage if you like that; put them in the dripping pan, with bits of butter over them, and a little water in the pan; bake slowly till done. Make a rich gravy in the dripping pan after you take the chicken out.

An elegant and effective fringe for the ends of a table scarf may be made of a piece of figured plush; cover the figures with bright colored silk in plain, long filling stitches, and around the edge of each design sew tiny gilt braid.

Late pears with an equal quantity of rusty coat apples make excellent preserves. Use half a pound of sugar to each pound of fruit. If you cannot get the pears take the apples alone, cut them in quarters, stick a clove in each quarter, and put a few sticks of cinnamon in the syrup.

Carpets, after being thoroughly swept, may be brightened by going over it with a clean flannel cloth dipped in water in which you have put a little ammonia. A teaspoonful of ammonia to a quart of water is about the proper proportion.
