THE CHICAGO EXCURSION. "I said go, and she started," said the "mayor of Omaha," as the Chicago excursion train pulled out of the B. & M. depot on the evening of May 8th.

The "stag" car of the excursion party was a panorama of merriment, stale jokes and bottled lightning. Cards commanded a premium of 25 cents an hour, the ebony porters having exhausted their stock on the first call.

"Here's yer Burlington papers! Buy a Hawkeye, Mister," should a diminutive newboy, as he cautiously approached an excursionist with a cowboy sombrero, plying a colored handkerchief on his flushed countenance.

The new building of the Chicago board of trade will be completed by September. It is a gray granite monster in size and massiveness. From the smallest detail to the huge granite columns and statues already in place, there is an appearance of lavish devotion to art in cold stone.

The panorama of the battle of Gettysburg is one of the greatest sights in Chicago. It is inclosed in a circular brick building with iron roof. The visitor when he enters the building in the center of panoramas, is bewildered by the sight presented.

The artist of the panorama is said to have received only \$4,000 for his work. The first owner expended \$100,000 in mounting it and at the end of six months sold it to the present owners at a cash price of \$60,000, besides the receipts for the first six months.

The spaces between the blocks are filled with lake gravel and covered with hot pitch, which makes the paving practically water tight.
