TEMPERANCE TRANSFERS.

The Iowa Railroads Will Refuse to Transport Intoxicating Liquors to and From Points in Iowa,

The general freight agents of the various ailroads in Iowa have issued a special joint notice calling the attention of agents and connecting lines to the following section of an act relating to intoxicating liquors passed by the Iowa legislature at its recent session, and which takes effect July 4, 1884;

Sec. 1,553. If any express company, railway company, or agent, or person in the employ of any express company or railroad company, or if any common carrier, or any person in the employ of any common carrier, or if any other person shall knowingly bring within the state for any other person or persons or corporations or shall transport between points within this state for any other persons or corporations, any intoxicating liquors without first being furnished with a certificate from and under the seal of the county auditor of the county to which said liquor is to be transported or i consigned for transportation certifying tha such consignee or person for or to whom said iquor is to be transported is authorized sell such intoxicating liquors in such coun ty, such company, corporation, or persons softending, and each of them, and any agen of such corporation or company so offending shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceening \$100 for each offense, an shall stand committed to the county jail until such fise and costs of prosecution are paid and one-half of the fine shall go to the inform

er and the other half shall go to the school fund of the county.

And provided further, That the offense here-in defined shall be held complete, and shall be held to have been committed in any county of the state through or to which said intoxicating liquors are transported, or in which the same

liquors are transported, or in which the same are loaded for transportation.


