"Plated jewelry is far more service able than rolled gold jewelry," said Mr. Chas. Fass. "Rolled plate is made by sweating down the gold on the metal. In a process of that kind about the thickness of very thin tissue paper is used. This process was used because the name

When in a state of fusion it very easily and very intimatele combines with silver, and when mixed with that metal will also run into a mass with iron. No also run into a mass with iron.

metal destroys the maliability of gold so completely as lead; one two-thous-andth part renders it too brittle for rolling, and its very fumes produce a serious effect upon it. Gold is almost universally alloyed with copper or with silver, in order to increase its hardness. In speaking of he fineness of an alloy of gold, the mass is supposed to be di-vided into twenty-four parts, and the same is called carats. An ounce of gold is divided into twenty-four cartts, and old of twenty-two carats fine is gold of which twenty two parts out of the twenty four are pure the other two parts being silver, copper, or of other metals. Gold Owing to the increase

Silver, copper, or of other fields, Gold alloyed with silver is the yellow gold of the old market. To-day gold is freely alloyed with copper, and produces an alloy that is of a rich red bolor, and that is what you call "red" gold.

Currously enough, the presen republican rebels who will not have any thing to do with Mr. Blaine would seen to be made up chiefly from the free-trad-wing of the republican party. The centres of their movement are in Boston New Haven, and New York. They are political economists rather than politicians, and as to their number, there is no

present means of telling how great it may The election of this fall will unquestionably bring on a very large proportion of the whole number of the voters. In the eight years between the election of 1868, when Saymonr and Grant obtained together 850,000 votes, and that of 1876, when Hayes and Tilden aggregated 1,011,000, and there was an increase of 100,000 in the voting force of the state. It is not an extravagant estimate that in the eight years that have since elapsed the increase has been sufficient to make the voting force at the polls in November deliver the mighty number of 1,200,-

000 ballots. But how will thes ballots be divided That is a question which no intelligent politician will now attempt to answer with dogmetic positiveness. Taking the new 190,000 voters who will now vote for the first time, no one can say beforehand whether a majority of their votes will be given to Cleveland or to Blaine; and yet this majority may determine the result of the whole election. No doubt Mr. Ceveland will get a large array of suffrages from the bolting republicans, but on the other hand we fear he will lose many votes among the most respectable and enthusiastic portion of our citizans who are represented by William Purcell,

of Rochester. Then, again, there is no means of knowing how many working-men will go against him from distrust of his views as regards the question of free trade and the protection of American industry; and this is a loss not easily overbalanced by accessations from republican workingmen who are free traders. Thus it is a most perplexed problem.
