PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS, a joint resolution was adopted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, at the 18th session, 1883, and approved February 7th, A. D. 1883, proposing an Amendment to Section Four of Article Five of the Constitution of this State, and that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 1.—The Executive Department shall consist of a Governor, a Lieutenant Governor, a Secretary of State, an Auditor of Public Accounts, a Treasurer, a Superintendent of Public Instruction, an Attorney General, a Commissioner of Public Lands, a Commissioner of Agriculture, and a Board of Railway Commissioners.

Section 2.—The Governor shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 3.—The Governor shall have the honor of proposing and submitting to the Legislature any bill or resolution.
