LINCOLN, February 20.—The house met at 9:30 this morning, and after half an hour had spent in preliminaries, went into committee of the whole, with Mr. Leo of Merrick, in the chair, to consider the general appropriation bill. And then half an hour was spent in discussing points of order, during which much confusion prevailed.

When it was understood that the above was the exact position and that these were the only motions before the committee, Mr. Thomas of Cass, took the floor, so thought it extraordinary that the 329 students of the university cost \$230,000 for two years whilst this university cost
