and excited this morning on the European  
war news. In the early dealings there was a  
rush by the shorts to cover. The first prices  
were generally from ½ to 1 per cent higher  
than the closing quotations of last evening.A further gain of ½ per cent was made  
during the first half hour. This was followed  
by a slight reaction and some hesitation,  
Vanderbilts and Pacific Mail showing the  
greatest weakness, while grangers remained  
strong. The only potential influence through-  
out the day on the market was the news  
that was received from Europe regarding the  
prospects of war, and as this news continued to  
indicate the probabilities that a declaration of  
war was inevitable, prices rallied soon after  
midday and continued strong, with active  
trading in some of the leading stocks.
