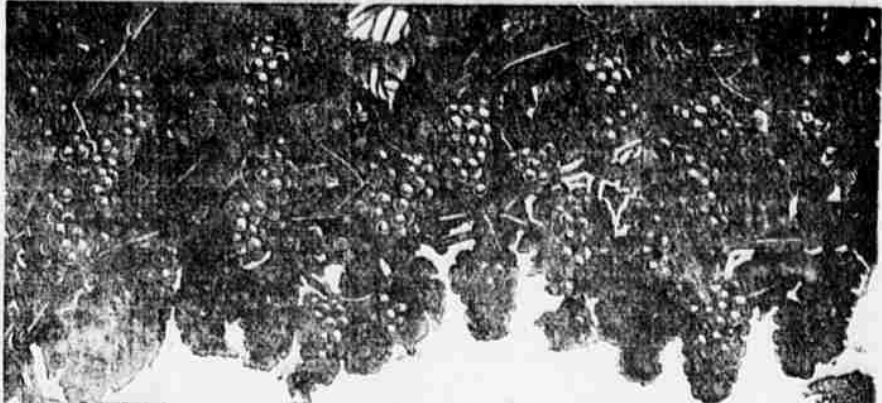

NEW WHITE GRAPE NIAGARA! Consists of a part of a photograph of a NIAGARA vine, planted in 1878.
