NY, June 25.—Money—Easy at 1 per cent.

Governments—A little more active and strong; especially 3's and 4's.

Stocks—One of the principal features in to-day's stock market has been heavy breaks in the Pacific Mail, accompanied by very large transactions in the stocks. There were rumors on the street early this morning that this company had lost one of its steamers. After opening a shade lower at 51@, stocks rapidly sold down, and on rumors before anything definite was known, to 50@, that price being reached in the first hour. It then rallied in the forenoon to 52@, and was active and feverish during most of the afternoon, finally closing at 51@, at a decline of 2@. The general list was strong in the early dealings, and the market decidedly active. During the afternoon prices were comparatively steady and business much more restricted, until later in the day, when there was another decline, followed by a reaction in which late losses were recovered, the market closing steady at 51@ lower than they closed last evening.
