Election Summary.

NEW YORK, Nov. 5.——The following is a summary of the results of the elections in the east and south on Tuesday, made up from the latest returns received from the several states:

New York elects Hill, dem., for governor by about 11,000 plurality. The state legislature is republican on joint ballot by a majority of 33 in a total vote of 160.

In New Jersey the republicans have 5 majorities in the senate and 4 in the assembly, making a majority of 9 on a joint ballot.

In Connecticut the republicans have 12 majorities on joint ballot, a republican loss of 71.

Virginia Lee, dem., is elected governor by about 25,000 majority. As reported, the legislature is democratic, that party having out of 100 members of the house and 25 out of 40 in the senate. The counties to hear from will probably increase their majorities.

In Massachusetts Robinson, rep., is elected governor by a plurality of about 22,000. The world claims that the democrats gain 15 members in the house and 7 in the senate.

In Maryland the democratic state ticket is elected by about 30,000. The legislature will stand about as follows: Senate, republicans 6, democrats 39; house, republicans 16, democrats 91; a democratic majority on joint ballot of 99. The successor of United States Senator Gorman will be a democrat.

In Pennsylvania Quay, republican, for state treasurer, the only state officer voted on, is elected by probably over 35,000. All changes in figures in that state show republican gains.

The Election in New York.

NEW YORK, Nov. 4.——Complete and corrected returns from the city of Brooklyn and Kings county make Hill's majority in the county 8,657. Very few returns from the interior of the state have yet been received, but everything indicates that Hill's majority will be between 12,000 and 15,000. The senate will be strongly republican.

NOV. 4.——The latest returns show Davenport's plurality in Oneida county comprehend 1,000, while republican senators were elected. Coggeshall for senator has 2,388 majority.

BUFFALO, Nov. 4.——Davenport's majority in Oneida county, 2,388, is the maximum to be heard from may increase it to 2,500. McMillan for state senator is elected by 1,501 majority. The republicans elect three members of the assembly and the democrat by a gain of one assemblyman.

NEW YORK, Nov. 4.——When the full figures of yesterday's election in New York are received it will make an unusually interesting study. At present it is safe to consider the following for the state and its cities. These show only that if the vote for Davenport in the state at large had been as full as it was in this city and Brooklyn he would have been elected. He was in fact defeated by what has always been his strongest support, the people of the state—the portion north of the Hudson river. Hill's total vote in the city falls over 9,000 behind Cleveland's, and Davenport's totals 14,000 behind Hill's. The total from Western New York total vote from Buffalo last year to Hill this year ought to have made a greater change than this, and the fact that it did not, indicates that many independent democrats did not vote for Hill.

The Evans Post gave Hill's majority in the state at 12,158, and states that the next legislature will be composed of 21 republicans and 79 democrats in the senate, and 78 republicans and 121 in the assembly.
