The receipts were very moderate and prices continue steady, sales being made at 20 and 21.

Butter—The market rules steady. Choice short, good demand but there is little or no sale for inferior grades. A good deal of butter is coming in now that has been held some time by the farmers or country dealers. Choice butter, \$1.50; fair to good, \$1.25; inferior, \$1.00; brick cheese, \$1.25; interior, \$1.25.

Poultry—Thanksgiving day is near at hand and would be well for shippers not to hold off their market as with few exceptions there has always been a glut just at that time and a great slack in prices in order to clear it out. The week before they are especially high and strong shipments of turkeys for Thanksgiving should be here on the morning of the 23d inst., at the latest, and as much before that time as possible. A great deal of fowl should be taken in the poultry as its appearance has a good deal to do with the price it will bring. Keep from two to four hours before killing a fowl unless sent to market. All parts should be killed by bleeding in the neck and picked before the body is cold. Scald slightly, do not break the skin; tie the skin over the neck joint; make a small incision through the neck and draw out the heart. If the animal heat is not all gone before the poultry is packed it will be certain to spoil. Very few live chickens are coming in a few good sizes \$2.00 per dozen, \$1.00 per lb. at 8¢; 10¢; 12¢; 14¢. Live ducks slow at \$2.00 to 2.25¢.
