Wheat Sells Lower Throughout the Day-Only a Local Business Done in Provisions-Live Stock and General Reports.

### CHICAGO GRAIN MARKET.

CHICAGO, March 4 .- | Special Telegram, |-WHEAT-In the privilege market yesterday afternoon the spread was very narrow, but the price was held within bounds without apparent difficulty. The amount on passage showed a slight increase this week. The tone of the public cables was encouraging to investors, but private cables were received violently contradicting public market news and declaring in positive terms that England was dull with a declining tendency. Conflicting reports were received of the operations of exporters at New York. They were said to be buying and they were said to be selling what they had already bought. Both sets of reports were on an equality so far as the surface evidence of reliability could be determined. May opened at 84%c, a loss from yes-terday of %c. It then advanced to 84%c on reports of export purchases, and declined to 41/6841/c on the contradiction of these reports, subsequently hardening on liberal and steady purchases by commission houses and remaining quiet to firm to the end of the morning session. The close was at 84%c. Crop damage reports were quite numerous, especially from Ohio and Michigan, and to this is due some of the later strength that was developed.

CORN-The only feature of note in corn today was the selling of 250,000 bushels of May by Ream. The disposition to sell was decided, but the market beld steady. OATS-Oats were unruffled by excitement

or large trading.

Provisions—The agitation in the provision pit was not so great to-day, and the market ruled comparatively steady. Pork opened 5c under yesterday, first trades in May being on a basis of \$10.25. The price dropped off a fraction, advanced to \$10,35, receding subsequently to \$10.1714, and then advanced once more to \$10,35, and closing at 1 o'clock at \$10,2716. Lard was not materially affected by the fluctuation in the other product. The volume of trading was not large, and seemed to be mainly local. The vicious drive at pork by some traders did not terminate with great

profit to them.
