Braided Wire to Be Used For a Great Variety of Purposes.

A Matter of Interest For Housekeepers, Hospitals and Fashionable Women.

factories are at No. 123 South Second St., Philadelphia, are the owners of patent devices which enable them to make out of fine wire a great deal of upholstering and dress material, which, for the service for which it is designed, is incomparably better and cheaper than anything hereto-fore invented. The adaptation of their filamentous fabries to household comfort is so far superior to the contrivances to which we are accustomed that the change will be in the nature of a revolution in certain lines of trade. The basis of the whole matter, however, is simple in the extreme. It rests upon that principle of resistance to the twisting process which we call "torsion." Fine wires are braided by a wonderful machine devised for the purpose—not as wires are woven, in netted sheets of certain width-but in a continuous tubular or cylinderical and seamless form, of any diameter desired. As the wire cylinders pass from the machines they look like long sinuous lengths of cobwed anacondas which one may see through. The wires cross one another diagonally, instead of at right angles, to the length of the cylinder. The cylinders, being afterward corrugated and shaped for the purpose desired, are ready for their various uses. Herein lies the difference between the brained and the woven fabric, and also the whole point and pith of this novel device. In whatever way a pressure is applied to the wires so braided and corrugated, the result is the required torsion; the wires are twisted, and when pressure is withdrawn they resume their original shape. Soft, untempered wire, so treated, develops a remarkable springness and stubborn retention of shape Steel wire, in the prepared form in which it goes into the manufactured article, after being subjected to 60,000 flattening blows, retains its original shape. These springs are, therefore, practically in-destructible for any use to which a metal-

In preparing the springs for special uses after being pressed into the particular form desired they are tempered by heating, and thereafter retain that shape without losing their elastic quality. Cut into proper lengths these braided Cut into proper lengths these braided springs make the cleanest and most comfortable mattresses which can be conceived of. They are just as good for pillows. Notwithstanding their constant pliability they are always in shape; they cannot be disarranged. Their adaptation to hospital use, as well as to cleany and comfortable housekeeping, seems perfect. For easy-chairs, sofas, car-sents and backs, baby carriages and baby beds, sleeping cars and for carriage seats and cushions these springs will certainly supplant hair, moss, feathers, cotton, wool, and all the various stuffs of one sort or another which has heretofore been made to do upholstering duty. Dust will not accumulate in chairs or seats cushioned with these self-ventilat-ing springs, and moths will not eat them

The manufacture of braided wire goods will no doubt prove an important addi-tion to the number of Philadelphia industries. The finer wire used is not made up in this country. The company is obliged to import it from England, using more of it than all other wire goods man-ufacturers of the United States put together. In time possibly the tariff duty may lead to the necessity of making fine steel wires in America, if money can be saved thereby or the cost of the goods refuced. Patents have been obtained in Euro-

Among other things for which braided wire has been found specially adaptable is the manufacture of bustles and breastworks for the ladies.
