THE SPECULATIVE MARKETS.

Wheat Prices Hold Up in Spite of Inactivity in Trading.

BULLS IN CORN DISAPPOINTED.
Provisions Take a Substantial Step Forward, Pork in the Lead—The General Cattle Market Improved—Quotations.

CHICAGO GRAIN MARKET.

CHICAGO, Sept. 9.—[Special Telegram to the Bee]—**Wheat**—The argument in favor of the market to-day was that it did not go down yesterday. With traders all standing around doing practically nothing, as was the case Wednesday, and yet with prices steady, with any activity, it was agreed that prices ought in all reason to do better. Part of the gossip is that Ream and his party have for a day or two been covering short wheat. The improved feeling concerning the general business situation has naturally helped. The advance in silver in London from \$22 to \$24 has helped just that much by making India wheat dearer. If there was a fair export business doing now there would certainly be quite a general descent from the bear over to the bull side. But with no news to back them, and with only a few glittering generalities in their possession, the crowd advanced October wheat 7½¢ this morning, but it quickly fell back and closed at 10 o'clock at 75 15/16.

CORN—There were only the same arguments in corn, and besides these, the bulls who had been relying on frost, were altogether disappointed, and yet the market opened at the best figures of yesterday, 41 1/2¢ for October. It dropped to 41 1/4¢.

PROVISIONS—The nervousness of the provision crowd was illustrated by the rapid advance in October pork to \$10.47 1/2, and the market closed at nearly outside figures.

Leopold Bloom was a large buyer of wheat early. He took 500,000 bushels in one lot from Jones at 75 15/16. The sale is supposed to have been for Bean. After this the market remained flat, but in the evening of Oct. 1, 100,000 bushels were taken at 75 15/16. The raiders then turned buyers. Reports came from New York that fifteen boat-loads were taken for export.

The anticipated receipts for to-morrow are 165 cars of wheat, 540 of corn and 100 of oats. Chartered were: Wheat, 80,000 bushels; corn 185,000 bushels. The close at 1 o'clock was: October wheat, 75; October corn, 41 1/2; October pork, \$10.47 1/2; October oats, \$6.65.

Armour was a big buyer of provisions to-day, taking 50,000 pounds of short ribs and then bidding 87 for October. Pork was sent up to \$10.42 1/2 on this Armour demonstration.

AFTERTON BOARD—On the short afternoon board the feeding wheat improved by four reported shipments of 100 car loads for export at New York (twenty-ton boat loads). The close at 2:30 o'clock was: October wheat, 75; October corn, 41 1/2; October pork, \$10.45; October oats, \$6.65.

CHICAGO, Sept. 9.—[Special Telegram to the Bee]—**Cattle**—Wednesday with over 11,000 head of cattle received, buyers and many sellers thought 10,000 to 12,000 might arrive to-day. But there was a material falling off in receipts, and for the week so far we have a decrease of some 8,000. The demand to-day was good but buyers held back in a reluctant manner as if they could not believe the receipts were no larger. The general market was more active than yesterday. Prices were very uneven, but on an average were 10¢ higher, being about the same as on Tuesday. Some prime 1,450 lbs. two-years-olds sold to a stock yards' butcher at \$5.10, and some fancy heavy cattle sold at \$5.30 to an Allegheny man, with some extra choice cattle as high as \$5.35. The best cattle sold Tuesday and the poorest Wednesday.
