WHO MURDERED KEATING?

Eye Witnesses to the Fatal Shooting Declare They Do Not Know.

TWO OF THEM ARRESTED.

More Findings to Help the Boom—A Touch on the Probation Question—Sunday Happenings in the Bluffs.

The Murder of Keating.

William Keating, who was on last Monday night, about 11:15 o'clock, shot by A. B. Schisler, within two blocks of the home of each of the men, died on Saturday night at his home, No. 1704 Fourth avenue, having lived just five days after the shooting.

Corner Paul repaired to the home of Keating yesterday morning and held an inquest on the remains of James O'Neil at the county jail for Schisler to appear before a magistrate, as the coroner believed by the evidence introduced that Schisler fired the shot that resulted in the death of Keating, notwithstanding the verdict of the jury.

Mrs. Keating is very sick, caused by the nervous shock, and was yesterday confined to her bed.

Other information were filed charging two other parties with the murder of Keating. The parties thus charged are Almer Reese and E. M. Hays. Both of these were witnesses to the affair, and they do not know who did the shooting. Under their own evidence they and Schisler were present when Keating was shot down, and as they do not say they did the shooting, it was deemed best to have them held on a like charge of murder, as it seems that one of the three must be responsible for Keating's death.

The information were drafted by Attorney Ware, and sworn to by Marshall Guannella. Warrants were issued at once for their arrest.

There was seemingly little effort to get at all the details of the affair, and the idea of a man being shot down with several standing around and yet no one knowing who shot him seems preposterous. The jury was made up of neighbors, which was perhaps ill advised, and one of the jurymen's sons was in the party when the tragedy occurred. The matter will not, of course, be allowed to rest in any such unsatisfactory condition, and will be probed to the bottom, and the facts brought to light. The stupidity of the jurymen will not, doubtless, be allowed to thwart the ends of justice.
