

RAID OF A HIRED HESSIAN.

Rothacker's Fight on the Charter Shown Up in Its True Light.

READY FOR ITS THIRD READING.

The Railroad Bill Recommended For Passage in the House—The Amendment For a Sixty-Day Session Counted In.

Villainous Work of Scallawags.

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 25.—[Special Telegram to the Bee.]—The mask has dropped and Rothacker's fight on the charter now proves to be nothing more nor less than the raid of a hessian hired by the contractors' gang. Rothacker himself came down tonight in company with Hugh Murphy, the paving contractor, and his repeating contractor, Fanning, of the street scavenger brigade. They immediately laid a brief conference with the vagabonds and roustabouts, who hang around the Capital hotel in the pay of the railroads and jobbers. Rothacker and Murphy went out in search of confederates late in the night with the evident intention to push through the house an enforcement of the mutilation of the charter by the judiciary committee. If this move is successful they expect the senate to dissent and have the charter finally beaten. Further developments between now and tomorrow night will probably show the hands of the scallawags who are engaged in this villainous work.

The Charter Mutilations.

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 25.—[Special Telegram to the Bee.]—The house judiciary committee will report on the charter bill tomorrow. The amendments to be offered by the committee are as follows: None of the executive officers to be allowed to be ex-officio members of the board of public works; section 14, requiring five days' notice of defects to be given, to be stricken out; the printing to be let to the lowest bidder with a sworn circulation of 2,000 daily two months prior to time of making bid; property qualification to be stricken out; taxation of railroad property as agreed to by the legislative decision and citizens' committee; five police commissioners to be appointed by the governor, two to republicans, two democrats and one a mugwump.

Doing in the House.

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 25.—[Special Telegram to the Bee.]—The house received reports of committees upon a number of bills this morning, and the bill which was entitled to precedence over all others was the bill to amend section 11, which was introduced by Mr. Harlan. The Committee on the Railroad Bill.

Upon Mr. Harlan's amendment to section 11, that gentleman started off by saying that the bill was introduced from the mercenary portion of the community, but spoiled it by entering into a defense of the railroad method of doing business. The bill should have their representatives here as they were owners of one-seventh of the property of the railroads. He referred to Mr. Harlan's argument in favor of a maximum rate as buncombe, and said it was the talk of one who desired the ears of the people, who were misled by the railroads. He said that the bill should be ordered engrossed and to a third reading. Mr. Caldwell seconded the motion.

Mr. Harlan's Statement.

He said the effect of the bill was to make the maximum rate applicable for the commission of extortion alone as well as discrimination, whereas in the first place it would require both.
