The following condensed account was crowded into a paragraph and recorded in the journal of the day: "About 5:30 p. m. Sarah Winnemucca came in, riding fast; had been to hostile camp; brought out her father and brother; others followed and were pursued, overtaken and taken back.

It is of sufficient historic interest to introduce here a few of the graphic incidents which she herself has since recorded: "We (Sarah and the Indians George and John Pintes) followed the trail down Sloan's mountain; they were in front, and then came to where they had camped, and where they were weeping and cutting their hair.
