ascended to the deck and found a terrible storm raging. I immediately went below and barely had I gained the side of Miss Munro when I heard something snap, and soon after that we were grating upon the bar and I knew the omen had come true and we were wrecked. The captain, who had now gone on deck soon returned and told us we had stranded on the Jersey coast. The boom had broken and had fallen upon the wheel, thereby rendering it useless for a time.

The crew at the station house was notified and a huge bonfire built on the shore near the wreck, for the night was a bitter one. The apparatus for the station was immediately hauled to the scene of disaster, and a shot fired that carried a line over the ship. The shipwrecked mariners were in no danger, however, and it was not until daylight that the breeches buoy was put in operation. The mate of the ship and a sailor were then hauled ashore. The remainder of the crew, twenty in all, remained on the vessel.
