Curious Devices of Some of the Immigrants. The peculiarities of the people of the different nationalities in their way of concealing money formed the topic of conversation at Castle Garden the other day.

Curious Devices of Some of the Immigrants. The peculiarities of the people of the different nationalities in their way of concealing money formed the topic of conversation at Castle Garden the other day.

"Most of the English immigrants," said one of the money changers, "carry their coin in a small case in which their sovereigns or shillings fit snugly, and have the case attached to a chain which they keep in a pocket as they would a watch. An Irishman always has his little canvas bag in which he keeps gold, silver and notes all together. But a great many of the Irish girls have their sovereigns rolled up and secured inside of their dress, and very frequently, too, inside of their corsets, and often have to borrow my penknife to cut them out when they come to get them changed."

"I have seen some old Germans who would pull off from around their body a belt that I am sure must have cost forty or fifty marks, and fish from it three or four marks in silver to have changed. The French mostly carry a small brass case in which they can place forty or fifty francs in bank notes, and remove them very readily one at a time, and only one at a time. There are very few Italians who don't own a large tin tube, sometimes a foot long, which they have hung around their neck by a small chain of cord, and in which they keep their paper money or silver coins. Swedes and Norwegians are sure to have an immense pocketbook that has generally been used by their fathers and grandfathers before them, and which will have enough leather in it to make a pair of boots. The Slavonians or Hungarians generally do not carry pocketbooks, but they find more ways of concealing what money they may have than any class of people I know of. Their long boots seem to be made in a way that will allow them to slip them off and tuck the ends of them they also carry the knife and fork and spoon with which they have eaten on their way across. But I have seen them take away from between the lining and outside of their coats which they would not let you see, and which are tonholes. Some of them use their caps, and very many use their prayer books, placing the paper money on the inside of the cover, and pasting the flyleaf of the book over it. But I think more of that than I can say. While they are inside of their stockings, than any other place, and don't take their stockings off from the time it is put on until they want to change it."

Big Salaries of New York Preachers.

The rich churches pay extraordinary salaries. The Broadway tabernacle, for instance, has advanced its pastor, W. M. Taylor, until he now receives \$15,000 a year. He gets, in fact, more in a month than most country preachers during the whole year. Taylor is now paying Rector Dix \$12,000, but when he married an elegant housewife he was his usual and it is said that his salary is now \$20,000. John Hall received \$10,000 at first, but now has \$12,000 and a house. He could have more by asking for it, for his congregation includes \$50,000 worth. John R. Paxton, who preaches to the Flaglers, and also to Russell Sage and the Goulds, together with other opulent men, has a salary of \$12,000. Grace and St. Thomas are both rich enough to pay their clerics \$10,000. Grace has a beautiful rectory, and Morgan, who preaches in St. Thomas, is a rich man, independent of his salary. McArthur, the baptist, is said to be equally well paid, and two of his deacons are Episcopalians and Armenians; also have over \$10,000, while other city pastors receive from \$6,000 down to one-half that sum. Judson, who is laboring so ardently at the Borsena church, is poorly paid, but he has the satisfaction of being the only one who is a clergyman, and thus highly paid, there is a large number of the profession hanging round the churches and glad to get a chance to supply a pulpit. Like all other professions, the clergy drift to the city in search of employment and try for any opening in benevolent societies, or even city mission labor, which is the poorest paid clerical service, and yet there is a pressure for every vacancy.
