A WONDERFUL LITTLE RAILROAD

Grand Feat of Engineering Just Achieved in Southern California. The Aptos creek debounches into the bay of Monterey, says the San Jose (Cal.) Herald, and running up this creek seven miles to the base of the grim old Loma Prieta is a railroad built and owned by the Loma Prieta Lumber com-pany. This wonderful little road, hidlen away in the bowels of the mounden away in the bowels of the mountains and creeping up to the Aptos gulch, is, besides being the prettiest bit of railroad scenery in California, the most remarkable feat of railroad engineering north of Peru. Five miles of road was built four years ago. The timber having been cut out within reach of the railroad, the company greatly desired to extend the road two miles farther up in order to feach the magfarther up in order to feach the mag-nificent basin of the Aptos, a wide flat opening in the heart of the mountains filled with some of the finest redwoed timber on the coast. But there appeared to be insuperable difficulties in to explore the route, and they reported it impracticable. The grades were too steep, the garges too narrow, and the curves too short. The company at last appealed to Mr. McLead, who went and looked over the ground.

"I can build it," he said, "if you back me with money."

"You may have all the money you want," was the reply.

He went to work last June, and has just finished the road. It is a remarkable achievement.

Some idea of the difficulties that had to be overcome may be gathered from a knowledge of these facts: The average

grade of the new extension is 211 feet to the mile, the maximum grade being 264 feet. The maximum curvature is 24 degrees (that is an angle of 24 degrees in every 100 feet). When the basin is reached (through which the read runs a mile) there are lighter grades and heavier curves, there being one 26-degree curve, making a total angle of 97 degrees. The grades of 211 feet are on the 24-degree curves, the grades of 264 feet being on the tangents. The road crosses and recresses the creek many times, requiring numerous trestles and bridges. On one of these bridges there is a curvature of 18 degrees on a fifty-foot span. At the high bridge, a fine piece of work, the track is seventy-five feet above the bed of the creek, and a quarter of a mile above it, at "Devil's Gate," a narrow gorge occupied wholly by the creek the road is cut through the rock and is only seven feet above the creek. This gorge was a difficult passage, two bridges being required in a space of 150 feet. A queer-looking locomotive, a powerful machine that carries its water on its back, is kept on this road, making daily trips. In the summer a passenger locomotive and train will run to Loma Prieta, and beyond that the queer locomotive will run to the end of the road and bring down the timber to be cut at Lomo Prieta. So steep is the grade that very slow progress is made, and in coming down the brakes have to be set very hard. It is a charming ride from beginning to end. All the lumber is cut at Loma Prieta, where there is a little town and a big mill. The mill has a large circular saw, with an oversaw, and they cut boards six feet wide and have a capacity of 60,000 feet a day.
