THEY MEET AT THE UNION CLUB.

The Urgency of the Northwest and Southwest Outlets Fully Explained and the Cost and Profits Intelligently Explained.

Mr. Francis Smith's Letter.

Frank Colpeter presided over a party of Union club gentlemen who gathered about the consulting table in the reading rooms of the club last night to agitate the subject of building a railroad to the northwest and southwest and furnish Omaha with better railroad facilities.

Mr. A. J. Poppleton was of the opinion that it was waste of time to create an organization until it was definitely known whether the country would subscribe funds towards it.

Dr. Miller, taking up Mr. Colpeter's suggestion that the line of the road should not be decided upon as yet, was of the opinion that the people who asked to subsidize funds for the road, the first question they would ask was in what direction it was to go.

Herman Kuntze favored the bending of the efforts of the organization in one direction, and to fully decide whether the road was to be built to the northwest or southwest.

Mr. Poppleton confessed that Mr. Smith's letter had been read to him and he pointed out the fact that the railroads, in competing for business, were discriminating against Omaha—something that Mr. Smith was unable to see.

Dr. Miller favored the building of a railroad to the northwest, saying that after the road was built into the north for a distance of one hundred and fifty miles a new country, yet undeveloped, would be found.

Mr. Kuntze admitted that no trouble would be experienced in placing the road provided it could be shown that the road was making running expenses had enough to pay the fixed charges on the bonds.
