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WAS THE WOMAN KIDNAPPED.

Some Sensational Assertions in the Ciede Fleming Case. OFFICERS COMING FOR ORMSBY. He is Charged With Having Completely Ignored an Order of the Court in Taking Away His Prisoner.

Did Ormsby Steal His Prisoner? The St. Louis Post-Dispatch devotes more than a column to the Ciede Fleming case which was referred to in yesterday's Bee, and in its issue asserts that 'it is probable to become a Celebrated One in the Courts.'

Then comes this, which may or may not prove somewhat startling. It is certainly true that the authorities in particular and persons possessed of curiosity generally: 'Judge Campbell ordered a capias to issue, directed to the sheriff, requiring him to seek for Ciede Fleming and bring him to St. Louis.'

'The capias was issued and Sheriff Pohlman will secure regulation papers and then telegraph to Omaha to have Ormsby arrested if he can be located and brought back here if it is secured and Ormsby back here it will go pretty hard with him.'
