

COMPLETELY OUT-GENERATED.

Prohibitionists Find Cold Comfort in the Work of the Convention.

THEIR PLANS FOILED BY ROSEWATER.

The Platform Don't Mention Prohibition, the Committee in the Hands of the Philistines, and the Party Machinery Out of Reach.

LINCOLN, Neb., July 25.—(Special Telegram to THE BEE.)—It is beginning to dawn upon the prohibitionists that they were completely out-generaled by Rosewater in the late convention.

But Rosewater was not demonstrative this time and shrewdly held himself in reserve for the moment when the convention was about to begin balloting for a platform. He followed the prohibitionists by not introducing any resolution in favor of license, and got a platform adopted which is now known as the "platform of the people."
