THE ODDFELLOWS' CONCLAVE CLOSES.

George Heceler of Barneston Meets Death in the Big Blue—Bricklayers Strike at Kearney—State News.

NEBRASKA, Neb., August 13.—[Special to THE BEE.]—Lightning last night struck A. Sheldon's house, occupied by a Mr. Hammett, three miles northwest, instantly killing a young man named Wilkinson, lately from Knox county, Mo., and Miss Jessie Hoback of Atcoa present. The building was hardly shattered.

Close of the Oddfellows' Conclave. PLATTEVILLE, Neb., August 13.—[Special Telegram to THE BEE.]—The Oddfellow's annual conclave is over and that for next year is secured for Omaha. Chapman, president of the Oddfellow's Lodge, Glenwood; Band, Band of Friends; Lodge, Daughters of Rebekah, of this city; visiting Independent Order of Oddfellow's, Platteville; Independent Order of Oddfellow's, Glenwood; city officials and citizens in carriages.

The procession marched to the Fitzgerald park, where an immense platform for the speakers had been erected and seats provided for upwards of two thousand people. A magnificent audience was present. After the exercises, the delegation marched in grand style to the home of Grand Chaplain O'Neill with prayer. Past Grand S. M. Chapman then delivered the address of welcome, which was responded to by Past Grand J. W. Humphreys, Iowa. President M. A. Chapman and the wives of the delegations in brackets. President W. The contractors refuse to pay extra for overtime, and owing to the large contract and advancement of the season, they demand ten hours per day from all workers then employed.
