There shall also be written or printed on the ballot of each elector voting for the proposed amendment to the constitution, the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution that the manufacture, sale and keeping for sale of intoxicating liquors as a beverage in his state shall be licensed and regulating by law."

Sec. 3: If either of the sald proposed amendment shall be approved by a majority of the electors voting for the sald election, then it shall consitute section twenty-seven [27] of article one [1] of the constitution of this state.

Section 4: The judges of the supreme court shall be elected by the electors of the state at large, and their terms of office, except as hereinafter provided, shall be for a period of five (5) years.

Section 3: "At the first general election to be held in the year 1891, and after the adoption of this amendment to the constitution, there shall be elected three (3) judges of the supreme court one of whom shall be elected for the term of one (1) year, one for the term of three (5) years, and at each general election thereafter there shall be elected one judge of the supreme court one of whom shall be elected for the term of holding the general election thereafter there shall be elected one judge of the supreme court whose terms have not expired at the time of holding the general election of 1891, shall continue to hold their office for the remainder of the term for which they were repectively elected under the present constitution.

Section 4: That each person voting in favor of this amendment shall have written or printed upon his ballot the follow
