Weakness in Wheat and Strength in Corn and Provisions.

PORK HAS A SLIGHT UPWARD TENDENCY.

Cattle Business Fairly Active with Prices Ruling Steady at an Advance-Hog Values Higher.

CHICAGO, March 19.—[Special Telegram to The Bee.]—The board of trade markets opened irregular. There was weakness in wheat and strength in corn and provisions.

There was considerable bear news in the wheat trade today and the market felt it. Perhaps the most radical change was in the tone of foreign buyers. There was nothing encouraging in them for buyers.

There is no rest at present for the man who sells corn short in this market. Indeed, there has been much regret caused by even selling out short.

The cattle market was strong and active at about top prices. Strength in the market was due to the fact that the receipts were light.
