There Will be a Shaking Up When It Goes Into Effect.

Four secretaries are to be appointed who shall be physicians of at least seven years continuous practice. Two shall be from the regular school of physicians, one homeopathic and one eclectic. The secretaries are charged with the duty of enforcing the law, requiring the registra-tion of physicians and looking after the enforcement of the general provisions of the

act. "There will be a general cleaning up next September," said a local physicuan, "when the new and old physicuans are required to be properly registered with the board. Then there will be a war on the quacks and fakirs that will be carried to a successful issue."
