KAUTZ A BRIGADIER GENERAL.

The Veteran of the Eighth Infantry Appointed to Succeed Gibbon.

SKETCH OF HIS MILITARY CAREER.

Enlisting as a Private He Worked His Way Up—Honorable Record in the Volunteer and Regular Service.

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Colonel Augustus Valentine Kautz, Eighth infantry, was today appointed brigadier general in place of General Gibbon, retired.

General Kautz is now commandant at Fort McKimney, Wyo., but was for five years stationed at Fort Sumner, N. Mex., and has had an interesting career, having risen to his present high position from the ranks. He was born in Germany and served in the First Ohio volunteers as a private from June 8, 1846, to June 14, 1847.

General Kautz was a member of the military commission which tried the assassins of President Lincoln in May and June, 1865, and was also the author of several works on matters pertaining to the army, among these being "The Company Officer," "Company Service for Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers," etc.

CAPT. CATLEY'S RETIREMENT. It Will Result in the Promotion of Lieutenant Waring.

The announcement from Washington that Captain Henry Catley of the Second infantry has been placed on the retired list created but little surprise among army officials, although many of them said that it was unusual that for an officer to be retired only when he had served but thirty years.

Capt. Catley's retirement will result in the promotion of Lieutenant Waring to the position of captain.
