

THE SPECULATIVE MARKETS.

All Evidence of the S. V. White Failure Swept Away.

CORN BROKE SLIGHTLY ON REALIZATIONS.

Quantities of Long Wheat Being Thrown on the Market Caused Some Very Aggressive Bear Sentiment.

CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 22.—There was no evidence in any trading pits this morning or in fact during the most of the session, of the crash with which S. V. White & Co. went down yesterday. In fact during a good portion of the session both wheat and corn were rising. After opening up at above yesterday's closing prices, there were advances until the rice market recovered about those prevailing before the White failure. Then came a period of dullness and weakness and finally a jump in wheat market declines were recorded, knocking off all the previous advances and more, and close in one of the greatest falls in the market for one of the bottom prices of the day. Provisions unlike the others were weak throughout the session.

The other wheat, which closed at 99¢ yesterday, opened at from 98¢ to 99¢, and with more minor reactions sold up to 100¢, sagged off to 99¢, firmed up some, but in the last hour broke badly to 98¢, and with a fall of 2¢ according to the market reports, closed at 97¢. The slump was due to late longer cables, the weakness in corn and the fact that the supply available on both markets had increased over 3,000,000 bu. during the past week. A good deal of long wheat was thrown on the market and the bear sentiment became very aggressive. All the late news reported long wheat strength was lost.

The trading in wheat was somewhat spasmodic. It opened active, strong and higher.

The demand was largely for October, and principally from New York, opening at 97¢.
