At a meeting of all the Boston National banks at the clearing house this morning resolutions were unanimously adopted that all the banks of the association should at once combine to relieve the necessities of the depositors of the Maverick National bank by making an advance to such depositors upon security of the assignment of their claims against the Maverick bank.
