MAKES LITTLE DIFFERENCE. Bryan's Bill to Abolish Tariff on Barbed

Wire Considered. The introduction in congress January 15 by Congressman Bryan of a bill to place barb wire and iron rods for fencing on the free list, and thereby take off the tariff on those articles by admitting them free of duty at all ports of the United States, has been commented upon to a certain degree by interested dealers in iron and steel. The local manufacturers and jobbers, at least a few of them, are of the opinion that the duty on baro wire and fron rods for fencing had just as well be taken off as to let it remain on. This expression of hardware men is made pecause there are no barb wire or iron fencing rods imported into the United States from any foreign country. Many jobbers and dealers claim that barb

wire and fencing rods can be manufactured here much cheaper than they can be imported if the duty charged be added to the ost price.

The duty now on barb wire is 6 cents per

The duty now on barb wire is 6 cents per pound, while on iron rods of seven sixteenths of an inch in diameter is 1.1 cents per pound.

W. J. Broatch said Monday that Mr. Bryan thought he would be catering to the farmers by getting such a bill through, but he would be mistaken, because no foreign manufacturer could afford to compete with this country even if the duty were off barb wire and iron rods. The bill, he said, would not make wire any cheaper, for the reason it was down to bed-rock at the present time. A few years ago he sold barb wire at \$7.50 per 100 pounds. Now painted barb wire could be had for \$2.70 and galvanized at \$3.20. These are jobbers' prices, and on car lots These are jobbers' prices, and on car lots 10 per cent is taken off from these prices. Mr. Broatch, while believing a turiff should be on many articles, could see no objection to having it removed from barb wire and iron rods. By placing them on the free list he thought one advantage might be gained. It might prevent the organization of trusts in this country, but fuuther than that no other material benefit in prices could be derived. The removal of the duty, ho says, would make no difference in the price of

would make no difference in the price of iron.

Mr. Andreesen of the iron firm of Lee-Clark-Andreesen, stated that iron rods were chenper now than ever before, and by the removal of the duty there would be no material change in prices. Iron rods and barb wire were about as cheap as they could be produced in any country. With the duty added they have been unable to compete with manufactories of this country. He also gave quotations which were similar to those furnished by Mr. Broatch. 1 None of the articles were being imported, and the duty on cles were being imported, and the duty on them had not been increased by the McKin-

E. P. Davis, of the firm of Davis & Cow gill, believes in having a duty on all material shipped in from foreign countries, but says that by taking it off barb wire and iron rod it will permit the formation of trusts. Still he thinks the dealers might be injured by competition on the raw material of twine being brought in and then manufactured.
