Heavy Selling Orders Rolled in from the Northwest. WHEAT FLUCTUATED WILDLY LATER

Oats and Provisions Show a Slight Advance - May Corn Advanced Two Cents and Shorts Became Nervous - Stocks and Bonds.

Chicago, Ill., May 11 - Heavy orders to sell wheat in May rolled in from the northwest. Much of the buying has been on account of the supposed sufferings of the natives of that region from drought. It is said that the alleged epidemic condition of the country up there staggered the bulls and caused the whole throwing over of long wheat. A temporary surge of selling in May was occasioned by nervous shorts, was the only feature. Compared with last night, wheat this evening is 1/4c up, while corn is 1/2c up for May and 1/4c for July.
