Methodists Getting Ready to Dedicate the Hanlsome New Broadway Church. BISHOP JOYCE WILL PREACH THERE

Brief Description of the Elegant Temple and Its Appointments-The Memorial Windows-Almost Paid For-A Bitter Disappointment,

Next Sunday the Methodists of Council Bluffs will dedicate their new Broadway church. Bishop Joyce of Chattanooga, Tenn , is to preach the dedicatory sermon at 10:30 a. m. and Dr. David H. Moore of Chicago, editor of the Western Christian Advocate, will have charge of the financial part of the exercise and will preach in the even-

& The church building is one of the finest in the city. It cost \$17,003, and of this amount \$23,000 has already been paid. The church is of brick throughout, with stone trimmings. The interior is finished in cherry. The seating capacity of the auditorium is 1,4%, including the balcony. The floor is carpeted with Brussels, and the room will be heated by steam and lighted by both gas and electricity. The main chandelier is of hammered brass, tipped with eighty burners, forty of them gas and the other forty incandescent electric lights. It will hang thirty feet from

the ceiling. On the north side of the platform is an office for the use of the pastor, connecting with the pulpit and the basement by a stair way. The lower floor is divided into several rooms, the main one to be used for Sunday cbool, class meetings, entertainments and the like. Separated from this by folding doors is the infant class room, kitchen and a number of other rooms to be used for such

purposes as may be thought best. The pullding throughout is equipped with all the odern improvements, and is one of which the organization may well be proud. On the north side of the auditorium is a fine triple window which was presented by the Sabbath school and which bears the name of the donur. Fucing it on the south side is one made to match which came from the E:

one made to match which came from the Ep-worth league. In the northeast corner is a double window dedicated to the dead com-rades of Abe Lincoln post No. 29, Grand Army of the Republic, Considerable disappointment is felt on ac-count of the failure of the company which was given the contract for building the pipe organ to have the contract for building the pipe organ to have the instrument on hand, ready for the dedication, as was agreed. 


