Both Sides of the Proposition Argued Before the Citizens Alliance.

ALLEN ROOT OPPOSES THE ISSUE He Says the Bridge is Not Needed and

That the People Have the Power in

Their Own Hands-Mr. Du-

ment Explains. The Citizens alliance held an open meeting at Knights of Labor hall, 172 South Fourteenth street, last evening to discuss the Nebraska Central bond proposition. There was

a small attendance, but considerable interest

was manifested in the discussion. Allen Root took the initiative and occupied an hour in teiling why the laboring mun should not vote for the proposition. Ite claimed that the contract was all on one side. The city and county paid \$750,000 to a corporation that only existed on paper. The Nebraska Central company was not bound to anything. They could take the bonds and then spend as little or much as they wanted to and the city would have no redress. There was no necessity for another bridge anyway. The present structure was not used to half its capacity. The tells over the Union Pacific bridge were excessive, but building a new bridge was not the way to regulate them.

It was in the power of the people to make the Union Pacific company reduce the tolls by increasing their taxation. Corporations were all alike and there was nothing to prevent the Nebraska Central from charging as high tolls as the Union Pacific. The speaker also argued that the city was not financially able to bond itself to that extent. It should pay its debts before making any further improvements. before making any further improvements. Mr. J. H. Dumont spoke at length in favor of the bonds. He took up Mr. Root's objections one at a time and pulverized them. He reviewed the history of the Nebraska Central company, which had originally consisted of twenty-five business men of Omaha who had endured the tyranny of the Union Pacific Values of the Control of the Union Pacific Values of the Control of the Union Pacific Values of the Control of the Contro

raliroad as long as they could. The necessity for a new bridge was greater now than ever before. There was to be no delivery of bonds until the company bad executed its part of the contract. In this respect the proposition differed from the bond proposition granted to the Union Pacific.

The ordinance provided that the company should allow all other roads to use its bridge, approaches and tracks. It could not charge excessive rates because it was provided that three judges of the district court should act as arbitrators in the matter. In return for the bonds the Neoraska Central company was to purchase property valued at about \$1,000,000, which would afford terminal facilities sufficient for all the roads that might ever come into Omaha. It was bound to build a \$400,000 union depot and a double-track bridge and a doubletrack road, when one track would do its business just as well if they only considered the demand of the present. A general discussion ensued, in which the balance of opinion seemed to be in favor of the proposition.
