





Attributes His Conviction to the Prajudices of Army Officers.

HE SAYS CARTER BIT HIM IN THE HAND

The Condemned Man Felt Sorry for Causing an Unpleasant Duty for the Marshal -Grateful for the Sheriff's Kindnesses,

The spirit of Clinton E. Dixon the soldier who was executed at the county jail last Friday, long since passed into the great beyond, but a confession remains. In that he admitted that he killed Carter, but claimed

it was done in self defense. In cleaning out the cell occupied by Dixon Sheriff Bennett found the following letter, which was written by the young man the night before this execution:

"My Dear Gentlemen: I accuse myselt guilty of the slaving of John R. Carrer, but not in cold blood. I was determined not to let him get the test of me, so I was prepared for him. When I called him out of the quarters to dispute our misunderstanding, he didn't give me a show to explain myself. When I said that he was no good he jumped on me and commenced to bite my hand, and when I got my hand out of his mouth 1, of course, like anyone else in my position would have done, tried to defend myself. I pulled out my pistol and fired the fatal shot

"God have mercy on him! If he had not bit me we might both have been at peace and liberty at this very moment, but that I leave to the judgment of my omnipresent God, and he is my witness to these words. "It was not justice that prought me to this misfortune, but it was the projudice of the army officers. Because I was a poor man, without money and without friends, I have to face the consequences like every poor man has to in this miserable world."
