Section 1. That that p.r.tof Davenport street from 24th street to 25th street, in street luprovement district No. 457, be and the same is to consist of paving with vitrified brick, class A. 10 years guarantee, according to the specifications on file in the office of the board of public works.

Section 2. That the board of public works is hereby ordered to cause said work to be done and to enter into contract for the same with the lowest responsible bidder under the specifications on file in the office of said board.

Section 3. That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
