SAW THE CORPSE BURN UP

Terrifying Scene at a Funeral Drives Mourners Into Hysterics. A GREEN HAND IN THE CREMATORY

He Becomes Frightened and Falls to Push the Fly Clear into the Oven—Spectators Horrified at the Spectacle.

New York, Aug. 15.—A morning paper prints the following: A revolting and most unusual accident occurred yesterday afternoon, during the cremation of the body of Percy Rockwell, a wealthy banker and confectioner of this city, at Fresh Pond. It was something that those who saw it will never forget and never be able to recall without a shudder of horror.

Why the funeral party—including a few relatives and forty-five or fifty friends—arrived at the crematory, the smoke issuing from the chimney told that the furnaces were ready. The hearse was driven to the rear door, where the coffin was lifted out and carried into the crematory. Along with it went a committee of the pallbearers. In a rear room the body was lifted from the coffin, placed in a shallow cradle and wrapped with alum-soaked white cloth. The corpse was hoisted with blocks and tackle to its position on a high table, calculated to be just the height of the oven floor. The door of the oven was thrown open and the cradle pushed in.

There was a hitch. One of the new men, afraid of the terrible heat, had hesitated. The cradle was sloughed sideways and the body was hurled away. A sight of the white cloth still resting upon the table outside. The oven was glowing like one huge white hot ember. Long, thin, hungry flames were playing on the floor, and the heat and tongue of angry serpents hissing about their prey. For a second the alum-soaked cloth protected the body, long enough for the door to have been closed, but the sight had been too much for the man. He had been a witness to the black portent and the shock of the accident. He had seen the white face and hands folded over the breast, with the flames playing wildly about the face and body.

When he screamed and sobbed uncontrollably, and strong men gazed, awestruck and shuddering with horror. It was a spectacle hideous beyond description. There was another huge charge then and the flaming body was pressed wholly into the oven.

"Keep quiet; stand back, men, stand back," shouted one man. "It's all right now." A dozen men were about to press forward, when a sudden cry of "Look out!" had been bellowed at first and then inarticulate yells started to follow. Any interference by them, the delay so much as the body of a woman, would have been a catastrophe. The iron door closed with a clang and the agony was over. Women were being led out hysterical, and men staggered out fainting, his faces white as sheet.

It was several minutes before the excitement subsided. The superintendent, in his shock and anger, ordered the door to be opened, had burned out and blistered one side of his face. Said he: "I only regret the delay, the only one of the kind that ever happened here. The women who were with me and my friends, who were with me and my friends, were frightened or overcome by the heat, and loosed his hold on the rod with which they were pushing the cradle away. A sight of the white cloth, which had been soiled with a woman's hair, and one man on that side could not push his way so strong as the other side. He was a very capable thing, something that would not happen again in a lifetime."
