LONDON'S HEALTH IN PERIL

England's Metropolis Cannot Escape a Visit from the Pestilence.

THERE ARE MANY GOOD CAUSES FOR ALARM

It is Now Said an Outbreak of the Cholera is Inevitable-Measures of Prevention Taken-Gossip of Gladstone and His Cabinet.

Copyrighted 1802 by New York Associated Press ! London, Aug. 26,-The officials of the local government board charged to watch the progress of cholera are tonight less confident of the metropolis escaping a visitation of the disease. The Gravesend cases are undoubtedly cases of Asiatic choicra. The medical officers who inspected the steamer Gamma, from which the cholera stricken passengers were landed, permitted a number of other passengers to proceed to London under the excuse that they had not been in contact with that part of the vessel where the infection showed itself. To assuage alarm the authorities allege precautions were taken to disinfect the passengers, but this statement, which has only been made since the character of the disease deciared itself, is discredited. With infected persons here probably roaming about the metropolis some outbreak of the disease in London is considerea inevitable.

Poorly Guarded Against the Cholera, The port of London is not properly watched. The sanitary commission has applied for a vast increase of staff, otherwise it cannot undertage the survillance of ships entering the Thames from infected continental ports. The port staff is being daily reinforced, as the officers are overworsed inspecting, disinfecting and burning clotaing, bedding, etc. But no Thames cordon will suffice to shut out the danger of infection. A stream of arrivals from the continent comes via Harwich, Southampton and other ports by train, without inspection. Railway and steamship companies, excepting the transatiantic lines, show no intention of suspending their ordinary arrangements, thus making supervision on the Thames al-

most valueless.

The authorities expect an outbreak and are preparing to meet it. Never were the slum districts so pestered by emissaries of the sanitary boards. In the East End, where the rate epidemic, that of 1886, killed 16,000 persons in a few weeks, the water supply has been tested and found to be of countful quality, and changes have been ordered in the filtering apparatus. The people of South London have been warned that their water

There is not the slightest sign of a pario apparent. The chances of a visitation will diminish as the weather cools and public confidence in the sanitary arrangements and vigilance of the authorities is absolute.

Gratified at Morely's Election Mr. Morley's return from Newcastle is an immense relief to the liberals who have been watching for the result with breathless anxiety. The party never excended money and energy so profusely to secure a local election. While the unionist candidate re-lied en local influences, the liberals imported, to strengthen Mr. Moriey, fourteen mem-bers of the House of Commons, eight exmembers and fifteen preachers—Episcopal, Catholic, Methodist and Quaker. All were Catholic, Methodist and Quaker. All were in the field daily. The contest became one of national importance when some adherents of the local party joined the ranks of the unionists. Mr. Morley's repute as a highminded and honest politician never shone brighter than when he declared that he was

ready to abandon his office rather than submit to indignity.

The laborites throughout the country resent Mr. Davitt's threat that the Irish members would foil the labor demands in the House of Commons if the laborites opposed Mr. Moriey. The laboricader, Mr. Champion, replied that they have power to destroy all chances of home rule. As Mr. Morley has triumphed, Mr. Davitt may now seek to reconcile the laborists, otherwise the feud will bring disaster to the Gladstone govern-

Morley's short visit to Dublin has confirmed the nationalist confidence in him, soon became known that had selected as private a visor, and probably under secretary for Ireland, George Fottrell, a man whose allegiance in Irish affairs has long been recognized by both English and Irish leaders. Mr. Fottrell is a close friend and inspirer of Mr. Moriey. He was advisor to Robert Hamilton, who was under secretary during the critical time succeeding the Phoenix park murders. The Irish leaders have al-ways been conscious that the key to the whole position is the under secretary-ship, as they will be satisfied if Mr. Fottrell is ap-

Gladstone's Appointments Criticised. Regarding the home rule bill, the London Chronicle's ignorant travesty of the result of the negotiations between Mr. Gladstone and the McCarthyites is not considered worthy of notice by the Irish party.

Mr. Gladstone's nominees for the great

Lord Kensington, the capain of the yeamen of the guard, has held everal offices in the household and is an old steemed courtier. If the queen personally elected the officials she could hardly have etter pleased herself.
