# WEEK'S WEATHER AND CROPS

Temperature Slightly Above Normal and Rainfall Eomewhat Under.

LIGHT FROSTS REPORTED FROM THE WEST

Too Cold and Wet in Parts of Nebraska for Corn to Mature Rapidly and Two More Weeks Are Wanted to Render it Frostproof.

Washington, D. C., Sept. 6.-Weather erop bulletin, issued by the weather bureau, treating of the temperature of the week, says that in the Rocky mountain regions, the south portions of Texas and Florida and along the Canadian border from Lake Superior to northern New England, it has been slightly above the normal, but in the remaining districts the weather has been cooler than usual, the greatest deficiencies varying from 42 to 62, occurring over the section from southeastern Minnesota and southeastern Wisconsin to central Texas. In the Pacific coast states there was also a de-diction of the temperature, amounting to from 3° to 6° in California and less in the remaining districts. The seasonal temperature from March 1 to date averages slightly above the normal on the New England and middle Atlantic coasts, the northern portion of the lake region and extreme southern Texas. A general though slight deficiency exists elsegeneral though slight deficiency exists else-where. Warmer weather is required for corn in the northern portion of the central valleys and the harvesting of this staple will not be completed before October 1. Light frosts occurred during the week in Colorado, Wyoming, South Dakota, northern Ne-braska, northern Iowa, Minnesota, Wiscon-sin and in portions of New England, inflict-ing but slight damage. A killing frost was reported from North Dakota and a black frost from northern Montana. frost from northern Montana.

## Deficiency of Rainfall.

Deficiency of Rainfall.

More than the usual amount of rain fell on the upper valley just west of the Allegheny range and north of the upper lake region in a belt from south central Texas northward to southern Kausas, with occasional heavy local showers in portions of the cotton region; elsewhere there was a general deficiency. Rain is needed throughout the central valleys and middle states south to northern Georgia. The seasonal rainfall shows a general deficiency in the Atlantic states south of Pennsylvania and in a strip of country from upper Michigan to west of country from upper Michigan to west Kentucky and Tennessee and from southwest Louisiana westward over southern Teras, New Mexico and Arizona. The Miss-issippi and Missouri valleys show a general excess. An excess of from seven to ten inches is needed in northwest Iowa and south Minnesota and ten inches in north central Nebraska.

Conditions in the Several States. Nebraska-Too cold and wet for corn to mature rapidly and crop will require fifteen days to be beyond injury from frost.

Missouri-Rain on Sunday was general and of a beneficial character.

Iowa-Corn is doing fairly well; rain needed for plowing pastures and potatoes.

North Dakota-Slight damage to gardens
by frost on Monday; corn cutting ended and

threshing well under way.

South Dakota—Weather favorable to un-harvested crops; corn maturing rapidly; harvesting of small grains about completed; threshing general. Kan-as—Conditions favorable to corn, which is much improved.
Oklshoms-Rainfall heavy in sections and

poorly distributed. Montana-Grain harvest begun and nearly finished. inished.

Wyoming—Some, light damage done by frost; harvest about completed.

Colorado—Conditions favorable for grass, potatoes, corn and fruit in northern and dry in southern portions; light frost did single damage.

New Mexico-More rain badly needed for the cattle; small grain all harvested.

Arizona - Crops in west doing well; rain needed on cattle ranges; crops not doing so well in east.

The past week has been slightly cooler than the normal, with an excess of rainfall in most parts of the state.

The temperature has been from 1 to 3° below the normal, except in the extreme northern part of the state, where it has been slightly above the normal.

The rainfall has been above the normal generally, except in the western part of the state, where it was below the normal.

The rainfall generally exceeded an inch and a haif in the eastern part of the state, and varied from iess thun a tenth to about a haif an inch in the western part of the state.

The ground is now in excellent condition for fail seeding, and some wheat has been sown and much ground plowed. Corn has made good progress and, with no frost for the next twenty days, will make a crop nearly up to the average.

low. Ripening corn has been retarded, but it is doing fairly well. With favorable weather the greater part of the corn crop will be safe from the 20th to the 25th of Sep-

tember. It is certain, however, that if a silling frost comes before October 1 it will catch more than the usual amount of soft Michigan's Weather and Crops. DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 6 .- Today's report of the Michigan weather service bureau indicates that the past week has been a very good one for crops. In the northern counnes fall sowing is being rapidly pushed. The drouth has not been broken in the southern counties, where the development of small grains is impeded. Plums, peaches and
