Wheat Opened Quiet at About Thursday's Closing Figures.

EARLY CARGES SHOWED STRENGTH

Bullish Feeling Which was so Rampant Thursday was a Good Deal Softened Yesterday - Northwest Receipts were Large.

CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 21.—Wheat opened quiet at about yesterday's closing figure and held tolerably steady for a time, though finally declining considerably and settling off below yesterday's close.

With these liberal offerings and only a moderate demand, the market soon grew weak. New York and St. Louis operators were heard from at intervals, but no further activity was noted.

At the bottom there was good buying on account of the heavy crop, but in the afternoon the bearish sentiment began to sell and prices fell.

On the whole, the market was a good deal softened and modified, although early cables showed a decided strength in receipts in the northwest were larger than expected.
