Pertinent Query in Connection with the Union Pacific Whole Loaf Order.

COMPARISON OF THE PRINCIPALS' CHANCES

Very Slim Opportunities for the Burlington. While the Overland Will Gain on Northwestern Traffic-Good Thing for Connecting Lines.

Chicago, Ill., Jan. 24.—Opinions differ as to the probable outcome of the fight between the Union Pacific and its transmissouri competitors. Reports are that the Burilington and Atchison roads do not for a moment admit that they have have been worsted and they cheerfully declare that the Union Pacific is welcome to all the benefits it may derive from severing its ticketing arrangements with them at functions west of the Missouri river. Their through business in connection with the Union Pacific has amounted to very little of late years, they claim, and its loss will scarcely be felt. They, all have traffic relations with the Denver & Rio Grande, the Colorado Midiand and the Rio Grande West-

far as San Francisco business is concerned, while the Atchison has its own southern route to California. On the other hand, the Union Pacific, with the aid of its allies, the Chicago & North-western and the Chicago & Alton, is making a vigorous fight. It has not only as-signed additional agents to this territory to drum up business, but it has shortened the run between Chicago and the Pacific coast by way of Omaha, and intends to do the same by way of Kansas City as soon as the Alton is ready to make the necessary change in its time table. Eurthermore, it is said to have completed arrangements whereby persons who desire to purchase round trip tickets may go to California via New Orleans and the Southern Pacific and return via the Union Pacific or vice versa. But it is on Montana and Oregon business that the Union Pacific expects to get the better of its rivals. The latter will have practically no show at that business, and as matters now stand the Union Pacific, in connection with the Chicago

ern, and are independent of their opponents

Northwestern, will make better time to fortland, Ore, than the Northern Pacific. It appears after all that the only lines benefited by the fight are the Northwestern and the Alton on one side and the Denver & Rio Grande, the Colorado Midland and the Rio Grande Western on the other. Whether the principals will gain or lose materially by continuing the warfare is a question to be answered in the future. The worst feature of whole situation is the demoralization that is likely to ensue in the territory west of Chicago. In the opinion of persons not interested in the fight this sort of competition will soon lead to the paying of exc missions and eventually to a slashing of

The action of the Union Pacific road in closing the Missouri river gateways and demanding the long haul has occasioned a considerable commotion in ratiroad circles, and the probable action of the Iowa roads in that connection is the subject for numberless rumors. It has been asserted that the Iowa roads would absorb the local, thereby being able to sell tickets to Union Pacific points almost, if not quite, on the tariff demanded by the Union Pacific. This is probably only a rumor, however, as the proposed policy is manifestly absurd on investigation.

The through rate from the Missouri river via the B. & M. and Union Pacific railways to Walla Walla, for example, is: First class, \$50.75; second class, \$37.25. Taking Ottumwa as a basing point, on the Burlington the local from Ottumwa to Denver is \$22.40 and the local from Denver to Walia Walla is \$52.50, a total of \$74.90 first class. this case the locals would have be shrunk \$14.25 in order to make a rate the same as the Union Pacific from the river.

On second class business it is a little more favorable. There being no second class rate from Ottumwa to Denver, the first class rate obtains. It is \$22.40 and the local from Den-yer to Walla Walla second class is \$28, making a total of \$50.40 against \$37.25, the second class rate from the river. That makes a dif-ference of \$13.15 which would have to be absorbed in order to make the situation favorable to lowe lines.

SUPREME COURT VACANCIES.

Proposition from the Chicago Bar to Pro-

vide for Ex-Presidents. Chicago, Ill., Jan. 24. - At an informal conference of Chicago lawyers today at which the question of filling the supreme court vacancy caused by the death of Justice Lamar was discussed. Alex Sullivan made a suggestion that commended itself as an equitable mode of providing for ex-presidents in a definite way when they possess the required legal attainments. It was that at least a majority of these signatures petition President Harrison to resign and that Vice President Morton, who the country knows would make a dignified, safe and patriotic president, nominate General Harrison to the apreme bench.

Harrison's recognized position as a lawyer would make the appointment fit, strictly on its merits, while it would furnish the president with hard work, the best solace in his domestic grief, and make it unnecessary for him to return to his desolate Indiana home. The suggestion was received with favor, because it would provide a becoming position without the obnexious feature of being a sinecure for an ex-president, and at the same time give to the country a superbly equipped supreme court judge.


