BILLS FOR LABOR'S BENEFIT

Matters That Are Receiving Attention at the Hands of the Legislature.

SOME PROPOSED LEGISLATION DISCUSSED

Senator Lobeck's Compulsory Arbitration Bill-Anti-Pinkerton Measure and the Act Requiring the Labeling of Penitentiary Made Goods.

In the conduct of all affairs pertaining to organized labor there is atways assumed to be more or less necessary secreey which often works harmfully to such an organization by allowing its motives to be misconstrued by the general public. When it comes to securing legislation on its own behalf all this is reversed and the widest publicity is sought, but it is only recently that Omaha workingmen have attempted to make laws on their own behalf.

There are three kinds of organized labor in Omaha. Two of them, Knights of Labor and trade unionism, travel along parallel lines to a common goal with slightly divergent methods, but both have the strike and boycott as weapons of offense. The other class of organized labor protects its trade union not by a strike feature, but by legislative prohibition to outsiders.

Central Labor union has had a committee at Lincoln since the beginning of the present legislature and has progressed considerably with the work it set out to do. D. Clem Deaver of this committee is kept home this week by the severe illness of his child, but Mr. Frank E. Heacock, on his way to Lincoln yesterday morning, laid over a train to report what has been done by the committee. Compulsory Arbitration.

First and foremost comes the compulry arbitration bill introduced by C. O. Lobeck of Douglas, which has been amended in committee so that the lieutenant governor and the two oldest-in term of service-regents of the State university shall constitute a state board of arbitration. This bill provides that a majority, or a majority of a department, of the employes of any corporation, municipality, company or individual employer, shall give notice in writing to their employer or employers that they propose to submit any matters which may be in dispute to arbitration, then if such differences cannot be adjusted within ten days it shall be the duty of the county judge to at once call to-gether the state board of arbitration, who shall take evidence in the manner provided for in the district court. It is further provided that if either of the parties is not satisfied with the action of said board, then an appeal may be had to a superior court as provided for

in civil actions. Mr. Heacock feels sure that this bill will become law; he says: 'No law could compel an employer to continue to hire a man against the employer's will nor force him to give a workman fixed wages irrespective of ability or diligence. But this bill will throw the onus of refusal to arbitrate or to abide by the decision of the court upon the party declining." As labor organizations claim they never strike without an honest attempt at arbitration the men think they can secure public sentiment by compelling the employer to put himself on record as re-fusing arbitration if he declines. The bill has many other excellent features

toward conciliation.

House roll No. 11 and senate file No. 11 is known as the anti-Pinkerton bill, and, concisely stated, provides that a man must be an elector of Nebraska be fore he can be deputized by anybody to perform the functions of police officers, sheriffs or constables in the protection or preservation of public or private property. The punishment for the sherwho deputizes and the man who allows himself to be illegally deputized makes each good for a term in the penientiary of not less than one, nor more than three years. The corporation is let down easy by a fine of from \$1,000 to \$5,000. A little joker has been introduced by the opponents of the bill by the insertion of the words "except in extreme emergency." Mr. Heacock says that this mild mannered little trifle would "rip the 'hull bill up the back." But that "the amendment will be killed in committee and the bill surely passed.'

For State Boiler Inspectors.

House roll No. 118 provides that a state boiler inspector shall be appointed who shall then appoint deputies in every county but that the inspector and his deputies each shall have had ten years practical experience as a mechanic at boiler making. This bill is similar to the law in force in the state of Indiana and finds much favor among the iron workers. It provides a fair salary and rigorous inspection of every boiler, high or low pressure, in the state. Mr. Heacock is somewhat surprised at the favor it receives from manufacturers and owners of blocks and buildings where boilers are in use. They all see the necessity of such a law and are influencing representatives to make it operative.

Labeling Convict Made Goods

House roll No. 115 has been read twice and reported favorably by the committee of the whole for final passage. It mentions that barrels, tierces, kegs, wagons, corn shellers, plows, harrows, harness, collars and all articles manufactured in state prison shall be conspicuously labeled, "Convict made" and inflicts a penalty of from \$1 to \$10,000 and imprisonment at hard labor for not less than one year nor more than five years for disturbing the stamp or violating any of the provisions of the bill. Mr. His-cock claims that members, irrespective of party, are in favor of this bill and that its enactment will be one of the first acts of the legislature.

Pretty How-Do-You-Do.

Mr. Heacock says the following innocent little bill was introduced by Senator Page of Friend, Lincoln county: "If any two or more persons conspire and agree together with fraudulent or malicious intent, wrongfully and willfully to injure the person, character, business or property of another, or to obtain money or other property by false pretenses, or to do any illegal act injuri-ous to the public trade, health, morals, police or administration of public justice, or to prevent competition in letting of any contract by the state or the authorities of any county, city, town or village, or to induce any person not to enter into such competition, or to commit any felony, they shall be deemed guilty of a conspiracy and every such offender and every person convicted of conspiracy at common law shall be imprisoned in the penitentiary not exceedng three years or fined not exceeding

Where the Shoe Pinches. Mr. Heacock thinks that the bill would be the worst kind of a conspiracy iaw, as the very essence of a strike of workingmen is to cripple and injure the business or property of another who in such a case would be the employer. And

in the carrying out of a strike or boycott. say against a railroad company, pliable courts could easily construe such strike or boycott to be an act Injurious to the public trade. Central Labor union men say that "the other features of the bill are merely 'words' to conceal the real meaning which, it is claimed, is to make strikes illegal." And that "the punishment, three years in the penitentiary, would effectually dispose of any work-ingman who would dare to stand up for

Every organized body of labor in Ne-braska will bring its batteries into play to kill this bill. Mr. Deaver, the other delegate to Lincoln, puts it about this

Labor's Right to Strike.

"After a workingman has exhausted every means of defense and offense, conciliation, argument and offer of arbitration, what other weapon does he have left but to strike? Must an American workingman forever beg with bated breath and bended knee, and never stand erect and compel? What can we do when driven to the last resort but abjectly submit or strike? The lockout, oh, yes, the lockout, which is the employer's strike, is perfectly legal and proper, but we workingmen must just talk, talk, talk, and when we get tired—take water. You can say-that the fight this session, senator or no senator, will be made against this bill."


