TOM EDISON DOWNS THE BEACONITES The Goebal Claim Falls to Convince the

Court-A New Electric Locomotive -Devices on the Stage-Various Developments.

Thomas Edison scored another triumph in the courts last week. Some months ago the Edison company applied to the United States circuit court, district of Massachusetts, for an injuction restrain. ing the Beacon Vacuum Pump and Electrical company from manufacturing incandescent lamps. The Beacon company claimed that Edison's patent upon the filament lamp was invalid for want of novelty. This assertion was made upon an allegation that Henry Goebal, a York City, invented the incandescent lamp in 1854, and it was said the Edison patent was for no novel invention, or, at east, it must be limited to the ceil form of filament.

The court concluded a long decision by "It has often been laid down that a meritorious invention is not to be decated by something which rests in speculation or experiment, or which is rudimentary or incomplete. quires not conjecture, but certainty.

"It is easy, after an important inventien has gone into public use, for persons to come forward with claims that they invented the same thing years before and to endeavor to establish this by the recollection of witnesses as to events long past. Such evidence is to be received with great caution, and the presumption of novelty arising from the grant of the patent is not to be overcome except upon the most clear and convincing proof.

"When the defendant company entered upon the manufacture of incandescent lamps in May, 1891. It well knew he consequences which must follow a favorable decision for the Edison company in the New York case. Owing to he large interests involved. In a recent number of L' Illustration there appears an account of a new clace trie locomotive invented by Mr. J. J. Heilmann, and which is about to be tested by the French government with aview to its adoption on the government The novelty in this case lies in the

fact that the current is generated on the car instead of being obtained from sta-tions along the route. The boiler and steam engine, of the Brown type, are placed on the rear of the car, the engine being directly coupled to he dynamo, which is a separately excited machine. The current is four motors, each of the axles of the locomotive being driven by a separate The advantages claimed by the in-

ventor for the use of a dynamo and motors instead of driving with a steam engine direct are the absence of reciprocating motion, which will permit much higher speeds to be attained, and the automatic regulation of the motors, which permits the heat spent in the furnace to be more efficiently utilized than when the steam is applied directly to the locomotive pistons.

Stage managers have not been slow to enlist the services of the electrician in production of spectacular effects Stage-lighting combinations are every year becoming more brilliant, and in most plays the electric light now plays a prominent part. A clever use of incandescent lamps has recently been made in London theater. In the current play the hero falls asleep on a mound in a sylvan glade and during the scene the stage gradually darkens. In the background a cloud-like screen is seen to be ighted up by a multitude of tiny incanlescent lamps, which spackle and twinkle like veritable stars in the firmament. The screen is so arranged as to represent the celebrated star cluster in the constellation of Hercules, one of the most beautiful of the star clusters in the whole sky. To produce the effect 400 incande cent lamps, run on twenty distinct circuits, are employed. All the circuits are joined in two massive copper conductors, placed at the top of the screen, and each circuit is protected by an auto-

An experiment which may prove to be of great value in surgical operations has recently been performed. Local anas-thesia has been obtained by electrical means. Theorists have prophesied this result for some time past, but until re-cently no proof of its accomplishment has been shown in practice. A Providence physician by the aid of a carefully constructed electrical apparatus has produced local absence of sensibility on a patient suffering from a felon on his forefinger sufficiently to allow incising the felon without pain. By similar means in a case of tic-douloureaux an amesthetic effect produced cessation of pain in ten minutes, after which the patient enjoyed sleep for the first time in

The New York Board of Electrical Control will practically finish its work during the present year. Since January, 1889, over 15,000 poles and 22,000 miles of wire have been cleared from over the streets of the city. Exactly 33,649 miles of wire is now included in the subway systems, of which 1,200 miles carries high tension currents for lighting and power purposes. The in-sulation in the subways as far as has been ascertained seems to stand very well, though the general plan of con-struction of these underground ducts is merely three-inch iron pipe embedded in cement, with manhole openings at every street corner providing for hauling the wires through and making proper connections.

The British postal authorities are said to be experimenting in London with en automatic message box. You drop a penny in the slot and in return get an envelope and a correspondence card, and at the same time an electric bell is rung at the nearest postoffice. deposit your letter, enclosing a special delivery fee of 3 pence per mile, and a messenger comes in a few minutes and takes the letter to it, destination by omnibus, railway or cab. Such a system inaugurated by the United States government in the larger cities of this country might bring about healthy competition which would tend generally to improve messenger service.
