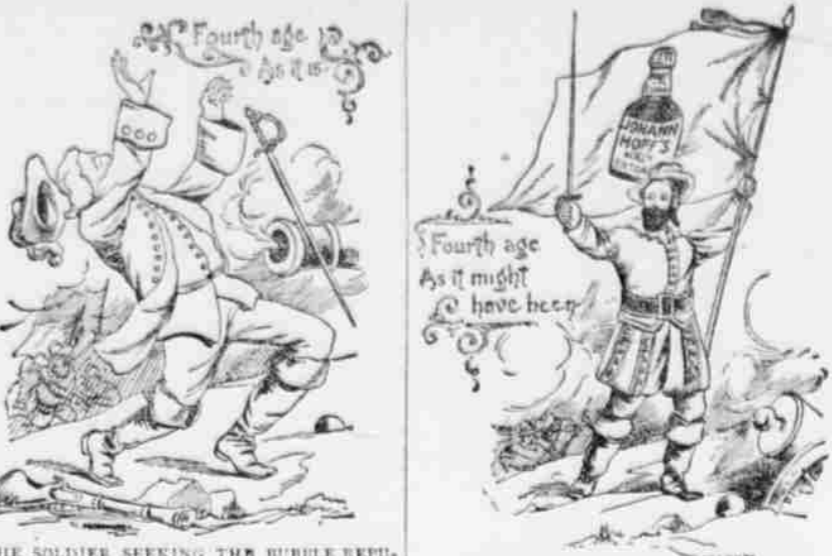

BACK FROM CHINA.

Returned Missionary Tells of Christianity in the Orient. Rev. J. A. Laymenberger, a Presbyterian missionary who has spent twenty years in the Orient among the followers of Confucius, is visiting Mr. Charles A. Uhl and family.

Speaking of the progress of Christianity in the Orient, Rev. Laymenberger said yesterday that according to the latest estimates there are now in China at present about 45,000 Christians of the Chinese race. There were probably 100,000 Christians in China at the time of the Opium War, but the thirty-four missionary societies now represented there are moving on nevertheless.

When the Christian religion once becomes so popular that it reaches a point where it ceases to be a foreign influence, then the victory will soon be won. At present it is very unwise, from a diplomatic point of view, to allow the missionaries to encourage or encourage Christianity. He will lose his influence at once by doing so. But the religion is gaining ground among the common people.

"If the Chinese were not so superstitious they might be much better off in a commercial sense and in every other way. They will not develop their mines because they have a superstition fear that they will bring bad luck upon themselves by disturbing the earth. They will not build railroads because they are opposed to railroad building and the erection of telegraph poles for the same reason. China possesses some very rich iron, silver and gold mines, but they remain undeveloped."

"There are thousands of wretchedly poor people in China. The people of the United States do not realize that there are many more than hundreds of thousands of people over there who scarcely ever get enough to eat and never expect to have anything ahead of present necessities. They are the most pinching economy and never have a mouthful of food or anything laid up for a rainy day."
