WEATHER CROP BULLETINS

Last Week's Conditions Very Favorable for the Farmers.

FARM WORK IS BEING RAPIDLY PUSHED

Cheering Reports Come from Almost Every State Great Improvement Noticed Over Last Week-A Bright Promise for Bountiful Harvests.

Washington, D. C., May 16.—The week ending May 15 has been the most favorable of the season in the spring wheat region and in the states of the upper Mississippi and Missouri valley, in Kansas, Indian Territory and northern Texas. The week was slightly cooler than usual from Pennsylvania and Ohio southward to Florida, including the east portion of the cotton region, the cool nights being reported as unfavorable to the crop in South Carolina. The season is from a week to ten days late in most sections, although farm work has been rapidly pushed during the past week in the principal grain states. From telegrams to the department, giving the general condition through the United States, it is inferred that there has been a general improvement over the princi-pal agricultural districts, aithough the weather conditions were unfavorable in the east portion of the cotton regions.

Missouri's Prospects, Columbia, No., May 16.—The weekly crop and weather bulletin for this state, issued

today, reports a temperature ranging from normal in the northern into 30 deficient in the east, central and southeastern counties. The week has been an improvement over the four preceding, with bright weather and rainfall, not varying far either way from normal, with warm weather overcoming any ill effects of the moisture as well as visibly improving all vegetation to an inestimable extent. It is still to wet for further plowing except in the higher fields and considering the amount of replanting to be done there is the amount of replanting to be done, there is need of long continued fine weather. The condition of the crops throughout the state

condition of the crops throughout the state is generally unfavorable, though the brighter weather is being taken advantage of to improve them in every way possible.

Wheat varies with the location, but in no case is a normal crop promised, while in places its condition sinks below 50 per cent. Oats promise as well as anything sown and the stand is healthy. Grasses and pasturage are doing well.
Potatoes have rotted some; fruits are looking better, but the outlook is still very poor.

Cherries, apples, plums, etc., are dropping badly to the ground. Corn is in bad condition and the most of the ground planted in which the seed has rotted will have to be replanted. Gardens are hardly started and early vege-

Nebraska Crops Improved. CRETE, Neb., May 16 .- [Special to THE BEE. |-Weather crop bulletin No. 6 of the Nebraska weather service, issued from its

central office at Boswell observatory, Doane

college, Crete, for the week ending Tuesday, May 16, says: Reports received from 120 observers in sixty county.

The first half of the week was cold and cloudy, followed by warm sunshiny weather the last half, making the average for the week slightly below normal.

The rainfall over much the larger part of the state was less than half an inch, but over a large area in the southeastern part considerable rain fell, being the heaviest in York and Hamilton countles, where it exceeded two inches.

Hamilton counties, where it exceeded two inches.

The week has been more favorable than any during the past month, and all crops show an improvement in condition. All sections have been visited by rains during the past two weeks, followed by warm sunshiny weather of the last few days, which have brought all crops forward and sprouted the planted corn. The spring grain, while it has shown an improvement during the week is still in poor condition and backward. In most sections more rain is needed and everywhere sunshine and warm weather are meeded to bring crops forward.

ward.

Corn is about two-thirds planted in the southern half of the state and about one-third in the northern half, being in this respect rather ahead of the average for other years.

Springfield, Ill., May 16.-The weather crop bulletin says: The temperature for the past seven days has been below the normal in the northern division, about normal in the middle, and below normal in the southern. There has been an average amount of sunshine, but the rain has been below the average except in a few counties. In the northern counties corn planting is being vigorously pushed, 25 per cent has al-ready been planted in some localities. In some parts of the central and southern divisions, planting has been de-layed by the rains but considerable layed by the rains but considerable ground is prepared and some planting done on the high ground. The low lands are still too wet. There is a marked improvement in the condition of wheat in the central division—good condition in the south, in some places beginning to head. An immense acreage has been submerged which will be a total loss. Pastures and meadows are growing well and stock generally turned out.

lowa's Favorable Outlook. DES MOINES, Ia., May 16.-The weather crop bulletin reports a favorable change in weather of the past week. Corn planting has begun, with the soil in good condition The bulk of the planting will be completed this week. A decided improvement is noted in the small grain pastures and meadows. The loss from rotting seed will not be as serious as previous reports indicated. There have been unprecedented losses of spring plant.
