DUN'S REVIEW OF THE WEEK

Business Shows No Substantial Improvement Over Last Week.

STRINGENCY IN THE MONEY MARKETS

Trade Has Not Yet Fully Recovered from the Recent Financial Crashes Reports from the Large Cities-

Failures for the Week.

NEW YORK, May 19.-R. G. Dun & Co.'s weekly review of trade says: Stocks raily from extreme depression, but business shows no substantial improvement. The distribution of products to final consumers is rather less encouraging, though the weather has been generally more favorable and at some points helps retait trade. Wholesate business and speculation show each week more hesitation with regard to the crops next fall, the possibilities of tariff changes and money uncertainties. Some large failures and many of minor importance show the effects of increasing stringency in money markets, and while money is comparatively casy here the pressure at other points has increased. Aimost everywhere collections are slow and doubt about the future effects of new undertakings, although the present volume of trade based upon past orders is remarkably large. The treasury is in a stronger position than for some weeks past, but exports of gold have notably increased.

Exports and Imports.

Exports of products in April were in value only \$60,612,680, a decrease of more than \$15,300,000, while the imports were \$84,991,092, an increase of \$5,600,000, so that the excess of imports for the month was \$24,378,412, and for four months of the current year \$86,233,918. In two weeks of May exports have but slightly decreased, while imports have been \$6,200,000 greater than last year. In such conditions it is not strange that a large \$6,200.000 greater than last year. In such conditions it is not strange that a large amount of gold has gone abroad this week and \$2,250,000 has been ordered for shipment today. The extraordinary bank failures in Australia, involving deposits, already amounting to more than \$420,000,000, of which over \$125,000,000 was due to British depositors, cause much realizing on securities and merchandise, the effects of which are felt in American markets. Nevertheless stocks have been decidedly stronger this week, with healthy American buying.
