New York City Veterans Pass Resolutions that Raise Widespread Discussion.

FARNHAM POST ON PENSION LEGISLATION

Commander-in-Chief Weissert Took Exception to the Pronouncement as Political and Suspended the Post-Correspondence in the Matter,

All is not quiet on the Hudson. The slumbering camp fires of the Grand Army of the Republic from ocean to ocean have been kindled into seething flames of excitement over the Farnham post affair.

Old veterans stroke their whitened beards and discuss the all absorbing topic with supand discuss the all absorbing topic with suppressed excitement and diversity of opinion. The outcome of the affair will
be watched with keen interest.
This action has stirred Grand Army men
more than anything since the return of the

Whereas, It is apparent to this post that some recent ill-considered speeches made in congress in regard to the pension laws are calculated to do serious injury to the reputations of oil soldiers and sailors and to the Grand Army of the Republic, and

Whereas, The only veterans entitled to pensions are those who, by wounds or disabilities incurred in the service of their country, are prevented from earning a living in their respective callings, as they might have done had such wounds or disabilities not been incurred, and whose circumstances are such as to justify them in calling on the country for all or support, and

Whereas, The Grand Army of the Republic is an association organized for the purpose of enabling oil soldiers and sailors to take care of themselves and each other, and

Whereas, As much real patriotism may be shown by refraining in time of peace from inflicting unnecessary burdens on the country as by coming to her defense in time of war; therefore, be it

Resolved, That any old soldier or sailor who applies for or accepts a pension, except under the conditions above set forth, is, in the opinion of this post, guilty of conduct calculated to injure the good men who were and are willing to give their lives for their country without any reward save the approval of their own conscience and that honorable fame that is due to every patriot.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the president of the United States, to the United States senators from this state and to the representatives in congress from these city, accompanied by a letter from the commander of the post, urging upon them to use their best endeavors to have the pension laws so revised as to make them applicable only to such soldiers or sailors during or within ten years after the expiration of the Grand Army of the Republic to take as soon as may be similar action to this, to the end that the reprosch may be t

hands of claim agents.

The resolutions evidently avoused the department commander of New York state. Some heated correspondence was the result and finally Commander Finn of Farnham post received the following from De-partment Commander Cleary on May 13:

Noah L. Farnham Post, No. 458, Department of New York Grand Army of the Republic, having on the 8th day of March, 1893, at a regular meeting of that post, passed certain resolutions and caused the same to be sent to the president of the United States, members of congress and posts of the order, without the approval of the department and national commanders, as required by the rules of the Grand Army of the Republic, and their attention having been called to their disobedience of the rules, and failing to make proper answer to the communication of the department commander, they were cited to appear before the council of administration and given an opportunity to purge themselves of contempt and, failing to convince the council that they had a proper sense of the wrong they had committed, the council of administration advised the commander to annul the charter of the post.

Now therefore, by virtue of the Department of New York, Grand Army of the Republic I Now therefore, by virtue of the authority
vested in me as commander of the Department
of New York, Grand Army of the Republic, I
hereby declare the charter of said Noah L.
Farnham post, 458, Department of New York,

On May 16 National Commander A. G. Weissert issued the following:

NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS G. A. R., Milwatker, Wis., May 16, 1893: The action of Farnham Post in passing and parading those resolutions before the public and disseminating them among the posts in contravention of the rules of the order, was plainly for a purpose hostile to the principles of the Grand Army of the Republic.

This nost, after deliberately violating the rules and regulations which are the fundamental law of the order, was brought before the council of administration and given an opportunity to purge itself of contempt, and refused to do so. It is therefore proper that it has been declared outside of the order and prohibited from farther participation in its councils. Its charter and property are to be returned to department headquarters.

llow Farnham Veterans Took Suspension. The New York Sun reports the following interesting product of the controversy:

The New York Sun reports the following interesting product of the controversy:

The Noah L. Farnham Independent Veterans, No. 1, is the name of the new organization which has arisen from the rains of the Noah L. Farnham post, No. 458, of the Grand Army of the Republic, whose charter was revoked by Joseph P. Cleary, department commander of this state, because the post adopted and circulated resolutions calling for revision of the pension has "without approval of the department and national commanders." The new organization was born tast night at an enthusiastic meeting of the members of the former Farnham post held at Wendel's Casino Forty-ninth street and Seventh avenue.

There was no apparent disposition on the part of the 100 and odd present to lament over the remains of the defunct organization; rather there was a prevalent sentiment over the end of the matter yet, and that the sturdy Farnham veterans would rise to continue the fight with renewed vigor. To nerve them on to the combat they had the satisfaction of learning that two other local Grand Army posts would very likely follow in their footsteps. The meeting was a secret one. The following committee report, made by General Finn, was decidedly interesting:

"Your committee went before the department commander. He demanded that we purge ourselves of contempt by an apology, which would put us in the position of admitting that our resolutions were all wrong. In fact, he demanded that we reached our resolutions, retract everything we had said, say we didn't believe it, and publish this to the world. The committee refused, offering the following apology.
