Wheat Reaches the Lowest Price Ever Touched on Chicago's Board. SIXTY-THREE CENTS FOR THE CASH ARTICLE

Decline Due to a Fear of Further Trouble Among the Elevators of the North-west—Weakness in Trading at Minneapolis.

Chicago, Ill., June 8.—Wheat broke all records today by selling down to 63c a bu. for the cash article, the lowest price ever touched on the Board of Trade.

The decline was due to fear of trouble among the elevator concerns of the northwest and was in measure confirmed by the weakness of the Minneapolis market.
