Bad Slump at the Close Nearly Spoiled Yesterday's Rally for Bull.

WHEAT SHOWED CONSIDERABLE STRENGTH

This Was the Result of the Better Feeling in New York and London—Corn Received More than Usual Attention.

CHICAGO, July 21.—A bad slump at the close nearly spoiled today's rally for the bulls in grain. The Milwaukee bank failure was largely the cause.

Wheat showed considerable strength during most of the session, the result of better feeling in New York and London. Cables reported steady markets abroad, while a good cash demand was reported from other markets.

Corn received more than usual attention. The principal feature was the relatively firmer tone to the near deliveries, cash selling up one time to the level of yesterday.
