#### AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Revival of Business at the Stock Yards Causes Increased Activity.

SEVERAL NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS MADE

ldle Men Put to Work-Terrible Deed of a Tough Tramp-Assaulted a Child -Public Schools Witt Open Soon-Gossip.

The scene presented at the Union Stock yards at South Omaha these days is a busy one, and the commission men, workmen and shippers are consequently in a good humor and happy. The cause for the unusual ac-tivity is the result of Manager Babcock's order placing all the laid off employes to work, and in addition to this he has put to work a small army of carpenters and laborers, who will be kept busy from now until the snow files, or at least until the stock capacity has been almost doubled to what it has been in the past.

A reporter for THE BEE was shown through the yards by Manager Babcock yesterday and given an idea of the extent of the improvement already started. On the filled ground just west and south of the Exchange building pens that will hold 6,000 hogs are building pens that will hold 6,000 hogs are being built. On the south side of these pens will be constructed a twenty-feet alley or driveway, which will make it convenient to transfer the hogs from one quarter to another. Just west of here is where the Texas division has been located. Prior to this year, but few or no Texas cattle have been shipped direct to these yards, but since an arrangement has been made by which South Omaha gets the same freight rate as Kansas City and Chicago the receipts have averaged a train load a day. The capacity for receiving these big fellows from the south has been somewhat limited, but when the procent improvements that have been started are completed the capacity will be ample for four train loads a day. Another handy feature about the Texas department is the new driveway that is being built to all the packing houses from these pens. There always has been a driveway to Cudahy's, but new ones are now being built to Swifts. Hammond's and the Omaha. This long chuts is built entirely outside of the steck yards company's grounds, out connects with the pens up in the Texas division. In the past these Texas steers had to be transferred to the packing houses in cars, but under the new system they can be driven direct from the pens to the packing houses just as they are needed.

Over on the north side of the Exchange

over on the north side of the Exchange Over on the north side of the Exchange building the capacity for handling cattle is being doubled. The former capacity was 3,000 cattle, and when the finishing touches are put on the pens now almost completed the capacity will be 6,000. A new set of scales are also being placed here. A chute will be built across the street from these new pens to the old ones up on the hill, making a complete connection, so that stock can be transferred to any part of the yards in short order and without any interference. The new scales are No. 7.

All this work was started some time ago, but when the financial stringency struck the

All this work was started some time ago, but when the financial stringency struck the country all the improvements were stopped and the workmen were laid off. All hands have now been set to work, and Manager Babcock says that nothing will be left standing still until the whole work is completed. The water has all been placed in the pens and so far as the cattle conveniences are concerned this work will be completed this week. It has cost the company a big sum of money to make the improvements, but the business demanded that it be done.
